This is in response to the February 15, 2006 Federal Register request for comments on Section 108 of the Copyright Act.

With respect to the Section 108 Study Group's Topic 1: Eligibility for Section 108 Exceptions, American Association of Museums, on behalf of the museum community as a whole, strongly urges that the scope of Section 108 be expanded to include museums, given the similarity of their missions and activities to those of libraries and archives.
